I. GENERAL INFORMATION

RULES (all rule numbers used in this document and on the appended forms and tables are from the 2007 Rulebook)

Introduction

The 2007 U.S. Midwestern Adult Sectional Figure Skating Championships hosted by The Braemar-City of Lakes Figure Skating Club, Minnesota will be held March 17-18, 2007 at Braemar Ice Arena, 7501 IkolaWay, Edina, MN 55439. This event is sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating and Skate Canada.

Rules

The 2007 Midwestern Adult Sectional Figure Skating Championships will be conducted in accordance with the rules as presented in the 2007 U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook unless stated otherwise in the announcement.

Results will be determined in accordance with the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook. The 6.0 closed judging system utilized for all qualifying and nonqualifying events at the Sectional Championships. At the U.S. Adult Championships, the International System of Judging (IJS) will be used for all Championship Level Events and those nonqualifying events at the gold level and higher. The chief referee reserves the right to hold qualifying and final rounds in all events. There will be no qualifying rounds in interpretive events. In dance events that are composed of initial and final rounds, final round placement will break all ties.

U.S. FIGURE SKATING BASIC SPORTS ACCIDENT INSURANCE POLICY

The U.S. Figure Skating Basic Sports Accident Insurance Policy covers all members of U.S. Figure Skating, including club members and Basic Skills Program members while participating in a duly sanctioned competition or club practice sponsored and supervised by the U.S. Figure Skating and/or their Member Clubs or Basic Skills Programs.

The following is covered under the Basic Sports Accident Insurance Policy:

- Injuries that occur at practices and competitions sanctioned or sponsored, and supervised by U.S. Figure Skating. Coverage is provided to the limits of the policy for medical/dental expenses and death/dismemberment as a result of a qualifying injury that occurs during an accident.
- Sickness is **not covered**.
- Re-injury is considered a pre-existing condition. Potentially chronic injuries will be examined carefully as they have a tendency to recur.
- Chiropractic and Physical Therapy care will be limited.

Please refer to the U.S. Figure Skating Risk Management Guide, located on the U.S. Figure Skating website at <http://www.usfigureskating.org/content/RiskManagementGuide.pdf>, for a detailed description of our insurance policies.

Age and Test qualifications as of Jan. 2, 2007 (close of entries) will determine event eligibility and classification. Tests passed after the close of entries and prior to this event will disqualify skaters if test exceeds maximum requirement for the event entered in this competition. Please read the test qualifications closely. U.S. Figure Skating and the local organizing committee undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the competitors or officials. As a condition of and in consideration of the acceptance of the entries or participation therein, all entrants, their family members and officials shall be deemed to agree to assume all risk of injury to their person and property resulting from, caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competition, and to waive and release any and all claims which they may have against U.S. Figure Skating, the host LOC and the facilities used and against its officers, and any officials, as their entries shall be accepted only on such conditions (See Rule 3222).

Events

The U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships and the adult sectional championships shall consist of the following events (See Rule 1440):

- A. **Events which require qualification from sectionals:** Championship Masters Free Skate, Championship Adult Gold Free Skate, Championship Adult Dance, Championship Adult Pairs.
- B. **Events which do not require qualification from sectionals:** Masters Senior Free Skate, Masters Junior Free Skate, Masters Novice Free Skate, Adult Gold Free Skate, Adult Silver Free Skate, Adult Bronze Free Skate, Masters Pairs, Adult Gold Pairs, Adult Silver Pairs, Adult Bronze Pairs, Adult Gold Dance, Adult Pre-Gold Dance, Adult Silver Dance, Adult Pre-Silver Dance, Adult Bronze Dance, Adult Pre-Bronze Dance, Adult Centennial Dance, Masters Interpretive Free Skate, Adult Interpretive Free Skate.
- C. **Additional events may be offered at Sectionals. These events are at the discretion of the LOC. Refer to the composition of events section in this announcement for a complete listing of events offered at your sectional championships.**

II. ENTRIES

The **DEADLINE** for entries for the championship events at the **adult sectional championships** is **11:59 p.m., Jan. 2, 2007** and for all events at the **U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships**, the **DEADLINE** is **11:59 p.m., Jan. 16, 2007**.

Test requirements must be met by **Jan. 2, 2007**. Skaters may only enter at their test level.

Age requirements are as of **Jan. 2, 2007**.

Electronic Entries: U.S. Figure Skating highly encourages the use of the online entry system. This has become the preferred method of registration as the majority of the process as a whole has already been moved online. You may enter online for the championship events at the 2007 adult sectional championships and for the 2007 U.S. Adult Championships at www.usfsaonline.org. For the purpose of electronic entry, the time zone of your home club

will determine the entry deadline of 11:59 p.m., January 2, 2007 (sectionals) and January 16, 2007 (U.S. Adult Championships).

A username (U.S. Figure Skating Member #) and password are necessary for online entry through www.usfsaonline.org. If you do not already have your password, go to www.usfsaonline.org and follow the instructions listed on the page. It can take up to two business days to get your password – so plan ahead! Double check the email address you have listed with U.S. Figure Skating to ensure that it is accurate. Additionally and most important, verify that U.S. Figure Skating is an accepted party by your server, therefore, allowing mail from headquarters to enter your inbox and not your spam folder.

Online registration will begin on November 15, 2006.

Paper Entries — In accordance with rules 3212 and 3241, any entry **not** postmarked on or before the deadline date and in the prescribed manner will **not** be accepted and the skater will **not** be permitted to compete. Faxed entries will not be accepted. Private postage meters are not acceptable.

Receipt of registration for nonqualifying events will be confirmed by email by Yvonne Bruderer. If you provided an email address but did not receive a confirmation, please contact Yvonne ASAP!

The acceptance of your paper entry is based on evidence that the entry was submitted on or before the deadline or, for an electronic entry, that the entry was submitted on time. Please follow the procedure as listed below for paper entries.

1. A private or personal postage meter will NOT be considered acceptable proof of mailing date. A faxed entry is NOT acceptable.
2. Entry forms may be submitted by any method that provides evidence that the entry was submitted on or before the Jan. 2/Jan 16 deadline, i.e., U.S. Postal Service, UPS, FedEx and the like.
3. If using the U.S. Postal Service, mail the entry from a post office desk and be sure to ask for a receipt, which will show the date, post office and amount of postage. Keep your proof of mailing. Do NOT put it in a mailbox. Confirm that the mark is correct and legible. *You are responsible for the postmark.* Late entries will NOT be accepted.
4. If you make a paper entry, a letter will be mailed to you confirming that Headquarters has received your entry form.
5. Electronic entry deadlines will be calculated based on the location of your home club and the U.S. Figure Skating server will refuse access once the deadline has passed.
6. Electronic entries will be acknowledged at the time of entry. Print this acknowledgement for your records.
7. Entry fees are refundable only if withdrawal of an entry is made before the close of entries. **Once entries have closed, entry fees are only refundable if the competition is not held.**

ENTRY FEES

Every skater entering the adult sectional championships must submit an entry fee. Competitors who qualify for the U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships by virtue of having competed at adult sectionals in championship masters free skate, championship adult gold free skate, championship adult dance or championship adult pairs shall not be charged an entry fee for those specific events at the U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships.

The entry fees are as follows:

For Qualifying Events:

- \$120.00 – Championship Singles Event
- \$120.00 – Per Team Championship Dance/Pairs (\$60.00 per partner)

Once entries have closed, entry fees are only refundable if the competition is not held. The chief referee reserves the right to divide or cancel an event when necessary.

PAYMENT

U.S. Figure Skating accepts Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express credit cards. Other acceptable forms of payment include checks and money orders. Persons using checks without sufficient funds will be charged an additional \$20.00 fee per check and all further payments must be made by money order or credit card. Skaters will not be allowed to practice or compete until all such debts are satisfied.

For Qualifying (Championship) Events: Checks made payable to “U.S. Figure Skating.”

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT SHEET (PPCS)

As part of the registration process all competitors competing in qualifying events during the 2007 Adult Competition Season are required to submit a planned program content sheet as part of the registration process (online completion is strongly preferred) in order to finalize your application. The PPCS is to be completed by everyone entering the 2007 Adult Qualifying Competition Season no later than close of entries on Jan.2 but can be updated up to one week prior to your competition.

Please go to www.usfsaonline.org and follow the instructions to complete your planned program content sheet.

MEDICAL REGISTRY FORM, MEDIA FORM

The medical registry form and media form are now **MANDATORY ONLINE** requirements as part of the overall registration process for all competitors entering the 2007 Adult Qualifying Competition Season. They are all to be filled out by the close of entries on Jan 2. but can and should be updated throughout the year as needed. If you have already completed one or all of the forms, please review and update each with any changes and continue to do so throughout the year. Go to www.usfsaonline.org to obtain a username/password (if needed) to complete this process.

COACHES REQUIREMENTS

All coaches requesting credentials at the adult sectional championships and U.S. Adult Championships, must be current registered members of U.S. Figure Skating AND the Professional Skaters Association (PSA). Membership forms for the PSA can be obtained on the PSA web site at www.skatepsa.org. Membership forms for U.S. Figure Skating can be obtained through any member club or on the U.S. Figure Skating web site at www.usfigureskating.org.

MUSIC

CDs are the only acceptable forms of media. **Cassettes will NOT be accepted.** CDs must be clearly marked with name, event entered and the music length. **Each CD must have only ONE (1) track on it. In the case of short and long programs, two (2) separate disks must be used.** Any disc with more than one (1) track will NOT be accepted! Lead in time (time before the music begins) on CDs may not exceed two (2) seconds. Each CD must be in a standard hard sided "jewel case" or CD sleeve, also labeled with the skater's name and event. Jewel cases and CDs that are not properly identified will NOT be accepted.

Due to compatibility and reliability reasons music may NOT be submitted on re-recordable "CD-RW" discs.

Competition music must be turned in at the registration desk at registration and will be available for pick up at the registration desk at the event conclusion. CDs will not be mailed back.

All competitors must have at least one (1) additional copy (CD) rinkside at practice sessions as well as rinkside during the actual competition event. The local organizing committee will accept no responsibility for damage or loss of CDs.

U.S. Figure Skating will supply current dance music for compulsory dances.

III. ELIGIBILITY

This event is open for participation to all eligible competitors who are members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating per rule 3050, E.R 1.02 and 1.06. For **championship** events at the U.S. Adult Championships and adult sectionals, non-U.S. citizens must meet the requirements of rule 3066. "Non U.S. Citizen Application to Compete" and supporting documentation must be submitted to the Chair of the Competitions Committee no later than January 1, 2007. Read Rule 3066 for complete details. Forms are available on the U.S. Figure Skating website Those entering **non-championship** (open) events at Sectionals and U.S. Adult Championships are *not* subject to Rule 3066, but fall under rule 3051B which states that they must be legal residents of the U.S. and meet all other test, age, and membership qualifications. Non US Citizens entering open events need only fill in the appropriate boxes on the nonqualifying entry form.

Skaters may not enter an adult level at a qualifying competition (Adult Sectionals/Adult Championships) and a standard level at a qualifying competition (Regionals/Sectionals/U.S. Championships) in the same kind of event in the same competition season and vice versa. For example, a skater may not enter novice men free skate on the standard track and masters free skate on the adult track in the same season, but may enter novice men free skate on the standard track and masters pairs on the adult track.

Skaters may compete in as many disciplines as qualified by test level but may compete in only one event per discipline. As an exception, a competitor who qualifies to enter a championship event in adult dance, adult pairs, adult masters free skate or adult gold free skate through their adult sectional championships may also enter an open event at the test level for which they may be qualified.

AGE CATEGORIES

Per rule 3292, there shall be age categories for all free skate and interpretive events, except championship events. For the 2007 competitive season, the age categories are as follows:

Class I:	21 years through 28 years
Class II:	29 years through 35 years
Class III:	36 years through 45 years
Class IV:	46 years through 55 years
Class V:	56 years and over

All age categories may be divided or combined depending on the number of entries and this authority lies with the chief referee. Events with two skaters will automatically be combined with the closest appropriate group. Proof of age is required for all events. Acceptable forms of documentation include birth certificate, passport, or similar proof. The LOC reserves the right to require additional information.

BYES

There will be no byes to the U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships.

FOUR OR FEWER ENTRIES

When there are four or fewer competitors in an adult sectional qualifying event (championship masters free skate, championship adult gold free skate, championship adult dance and championship adult pairs), the skaters shall be required to compete. (If there is only one competitor or team in an event, that person/skaters moves directly to U.S. Adult Championship

without having to perform at sectionals.) If, at the close of entries, there are fewer than four competitors registered for a qualifying event at a sectional adult championship, additional competitors from the same qualifying event in other sections shall be permitted to enter the U.S. Adult Championships in order to bring the number of competitors up to a maximum of 12 (or more if ties make it necessary). See rule 3172

ADVANCEMENT TO THE U.S. ADULT FIGURE SKATING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The top four finishers in each qualifying event at an adult sectional championship will qualify to compete at the U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships. Refer to rule 3172 for the fill-up rule for qualifying events at the U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships.

At the adult sectional event, medalists (first through fourth) in the championship events (championship adult gold free skate, championship masters free skate, championship adult dance or championship adult pairs) will be given an "Intent to Compete" form. This form must be completed and returned to U.S. Figure Skating by the Tuesday following the adult sectional event. This form will give the medalist the opportunity to withdraw from the equivalent open event (if entered) at the U.S. Adult Championships and receive a refund for that event. If more than one open event was entered, the "subsequent singles event" fee will be refunded.

*NOTE: Since the U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championship application is due at Headquarters before the occurrence of the adult sectional championships, competitors should consider entering an open event to ensure a spot to compete at the U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships.

All information required to be sent to the **U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships local organizing committee** (photos, practice ice requests, etc.) must be sent no later than the dates indicated on the U.S. Adult Figure Skating announcement. Any information postmarked after those dates will be accepted **ONLY** at the discretion of the local organizing committee.

IV. COMPOSITION OF EVENTS (Refer to Charts)

Well-Balanced Program Requirements

Recently passed rules which define the well-balanced free skate program for adult singles and adult pairs will be in effect. Please consult the 2007 Rulebook for complete description, however,, the Rulebook contains errors for the WBP requirements. Please refer to charts in this announcement for an accurate description.

Note: All adult singles, pairs, and dance OD events are "maximum time" durations, allowing skaters to have any shorter time-length programs without penalty.
