Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is a Junior Club Program?

A: Braemar's Junior Club Program is tailored to younger skaters (ages 4-18) who would like to further pursue skating and supplement the basic skills level (often called "City Classes").

Q: Why join Braemar's Junior Club Program?

A: Braemar's Junior Club Program is a natural progression in a skater's training. It serves as a bridge to introduce the skater and his or her family to full club membership.

Q: How do I get started?

A: First contact a skating professional (listed at right). Discuss your availability and whether you want private, semi-private (2 skaters) or group lessons (3 skaters).

Q: How do I join?

A: After talking to a Braemar Pro to set up ice instruction, membership forms can be found on the Club's website at www.braemarpsc.org/junioreclub

Q: When can I join?

A: Membership is open to anyone at any time. The membership year goes from July 1st to June 30th each year.

Typical Costs for Junior Club members

Junior Club Program: \$55 per year - limited to two years. To remain a member after two years, skaters would then join as a full club member (see back of brochure). Membership year is July 1st to June 30th.

Ice Cost: \$12 per session on a contract basis**. Ice sessions are typically 45 to 50 minutes in length. Ice session availability for Jr. Club members is limited (about five sessions per week). Check the website for details.

Coaching fees: Small group coaching fees vary depending on the number of skaters but may range from \$5 to \$7 per twenty minute session per skater. Individual (private) coaching fees range from \$15 to \$22 per twenty minute session.

Buy-on – skaters may purchase ice on a session-by-session basis, if available, from a stand-by list. Ice sessions are limited to a maximum of 22 skaters. Skaters will be billed the following month. See club policy for buy-on fees.

** **Contract basis** – skaters agree to pay for the same session for an entire contract period, which is typically three months. Skaters are billed monthly.
